



The Chapter Achievement Program (CAP) has metrics to allow Chapters to gauge how well they are doing in aligning Chapter activities with the IIA's North American Strategic Plan. The first level is Bronze which indicates that a Chapter has submitted all required reports for the year, referred to as Chapter Health items by the IIA. Completion of additional activities advances Chapters to higher achievement levels.

### **CAP Achievement Levels:**

Bronze = On-time completion of Chapter Health
Silver = On-time completion of Chapter Health + additional activities
Gold = On-time completion of Chapter Health + Silver + additional
activities

### Platinum = 10 of 11 years with Gold achievement

Ruby = 20 years of Gold achievement Sapphire = 25 years of Gold achievement Diamond = 35 years of Gold achievement



The North Central Florida
Chapter has achieved Gold
status since the Chapter's
formation in 2002. After 10
years of consistently
maintaining Gold status, the
Chapter was promoted to
Platinum status in 2014 and
has maintained this status
since then.
