BENEFITS FOR THE UNIVERSITY AND FACULTY/PROGRAM

- Universities in The IIA's IAEP program are evaluated and classified into three categories based on <u>The IIA's global Internal Auditing Education Partnership Program Requirements</u> <u>and Operating Framework</u>. A university's IAEP association could potentially benefit the accreditation of the university and rankings.
- The university gains exposure with companies adding to the overall placement of students in the job force, and enhances the opportunities for academic collaboration with leading universities.
- Periodic IAEP program reviews by academic colleagues and internal audit professionals help reassure participating students, faculty, and other stakeholders that the program remains current.
- Participation in the IAEP program facilitates engaging other stakeholders and provides opportunities to obtain support funding, and market the program to help attract top students.
- Opportunities exist for faculty research and substantive interaction with the internal auditing profession.
- Opportunities exist to share ideas and network with other educators from around the world at The IIA's annual IAEP Leadership and Networking Retreat.
