

Tshepo Mofokeng is the 2025-26 Director, Global Services on the Global Board of Directors of the Institute of Internal Auditors (IIA). He was previously the Chair of the Board of Directors with IIA South Africa (2021-2024).

Tshepo is the Chief Audit Executive at the Sefako Makgatho Health Sciences University in South Africa. He began his career at PricewaterhouseCoopers (PwC) and has since held other internal audit roles including being a director at a medium sized audit firm, in addition to being the Chief Audit Executive at the Department of Mineral and Energy. He also served as the internal audit, governance, and risk partner and director at a South Africa-based SekelaXabiso, and was also the firm's chief risk officer.



Tshepo is a seasoned risk and audit executive, widely recognized for his ability to transform underperforming internal audit functions with more than 24 years of experience, he brings deep expertise across auditing, risk management, financial management, financial reporting and corporate governance.
