The new Global Internal Audit Standards were released on January 9 2024, and will become effective January 9, 2025. Early adoption is encouraged.

The previous version, the International Standards for the Professional Practice of Internal Auditing, released in 2017, remains approved for use during a one-year transition period.

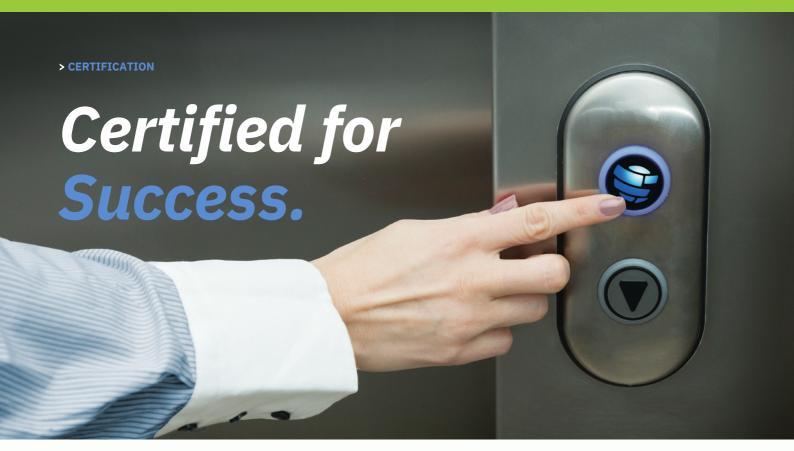
The session entitled "The Consulting Engagement" provided participants with an overview of the types of consulting engagements and the processes for conducting advisory consulting engagements.

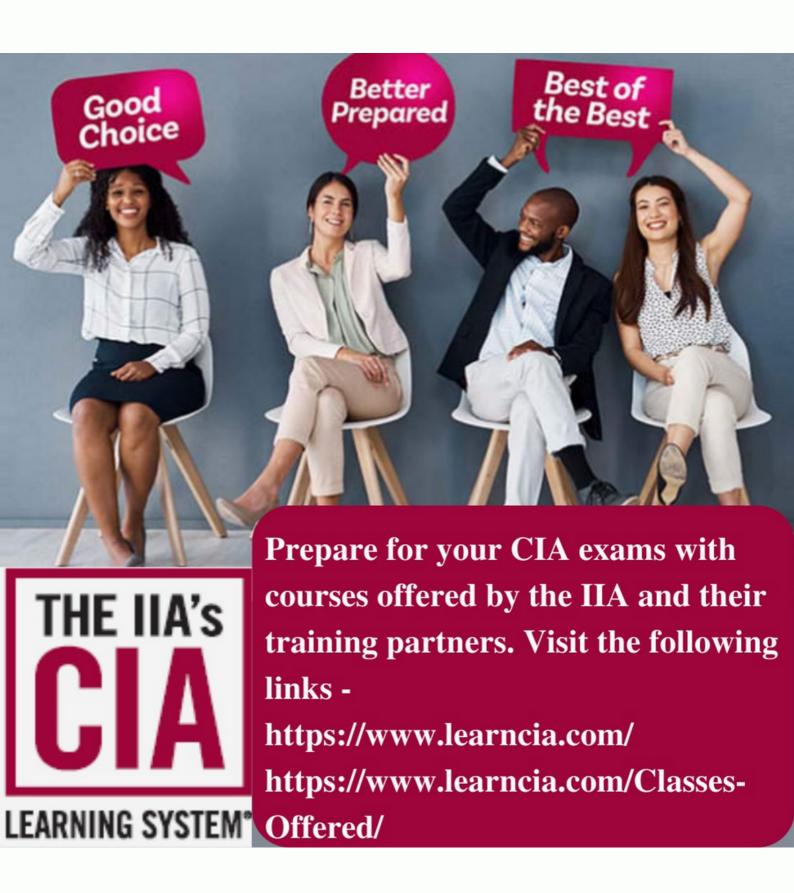

Active Internal Audit Practitioners opens a new pathway to the Certified Internal Auditor (CIA) designation, the only globally recognized certification for internal audit practitioners around the world.

The criteria for competition were:

- Be an active member of the IIA
- Be a beginner in internal audit, with one to two (1 - 2) years working experience in the field of internal audit.
- Follow the IIA TT on all three social media platforms AND
- Submit an essay which expressed the importance of internal audit within the organization which they were employed as well as explain their motivation for obtaining the certification, their career goals in internal auditing, and how the scholarship would benefit them.
