How I Found Internal Audit (and Why I Stayed)

I discovered Internal Audit almost by chance and immediately felt at home. While I was a junior at the University of Washington, Tacoma, I was invited to an internal-audit event at Seattle University. The session featured short talks from practitioners, with a few “meet-the-firms” style tables for networking between speakers.

As I listened to auditors talk about the work, the risks, the controls, the data, and the way they partner with teams to strengthen processes, something clicked. This is what I want to do. I joined the IIA as a student member right away and started volunteering after graduation. Over the past five years, I’ve served in various roles, and today I’m honored to be President-Elect and Chapter Secretary for IIA Seattle.

What I Love About Internal Audit

What keeps me in internal audit is the sheer variety of it all. No two days ever look the same. Some weeks I’m deep in understanding processes, data, and how everything fits together behind the scenes; other weeks I’m stepping into a completely different part of the business and learning something new from scratch.

One of my favorite parts of this profession is the people and the places it brings me into. Internal audit gives you access to corners of an organization most people never get to see. You learn how different experts think, how their world works, and then you piece together the bigger picture of what’s happening.

I’ve even been lucky enough to do this work in places I never imagined my career would take me, traveling on ships through the quiet, icy glacier passages of Alaska, and working across operations throughout Asia. Those experiences showed me just how much the environment around you can shape the work, and how diverse this profession can be depending on where you’re standing.

There’s something genuinely fun about stepping into a new area, asking good questions, piecing together the story, and walking away knowing you learned something completely unexpected. Internal audit never stops teaching you, and that’s a huge part of why it feels like such a great fit for me.

Why the Chapter Matters

The IIA Seattle Chapter has been meaningful to me from the very beginning. After graduation, a few coworkers who were active in the chapter encouraged me to volunteer, and that became my first real glimpse into the IIA community in action. Working alongside the officers and other volunteers helped me meet professionals from across the region, build friendships, and feel connected to something bigger than my day-to-day job.

What I love most is how the chapter brings people together, experienced auditors, students, career-changers, and everyone in between. Over the years, I've especially enjoyed working with students and early-career professionals. Investing time in people who are curious about internal audit feels important to me, because I remember being in that same position and how much it meant to have someone welcome me in.

For me, the chapter is about community, growth, and opening doors. Helping the next generation of auditors find their footing, the same way others helped me, is one of the best parts of being involved.
